- 4 los cepillos de dientes del adulto-tamaño (hoja en el envase)
- 4 nuevas toallas de baño (peso medio, la oscuridad o colores brillantes)
- 2 el ancho-diente peina (6 a 8 en)
- 1 esquiladora de uña
- 1 encajone vendas adhesivas (mínimo 40, variado)

Relief Kits



MCC is asking for donations of 20,000 relief kits as part of its response to the Haiti earthquake. Thank you for joining this response. Relief kits provide valuable supplies to families traumatized by war and disasters. In recent years, kits have been sent to Iraq, Gaza, Bosnia, Serbia, Nepal, Mozambique, Indonesia and Honduras.

Contents (NEW items only)

- 4 large bars bath soap (leave in wrapping)
- 1 plastic bottle shampoo (13-24oz; place bottle in a re-sealable plastic bag)
- 4 large bars of laundry soap (Some stores carry Fels Naptha, Sunlight or Zote brands; contact the MCC office with questions – 638-6911)
- 1 squeeze-tube toothpaste (minimum 6oz; leave in box)
- 4 adult-size toothbrushes (leave in packaging)
- 4 new bath towels (medium weight, dark or bright colors)
- 2 wide-tooth combs (6 to 8in)
- 1 fingernail clipper
- 1 box adhesive bandages (minimum 40, assorted)
- 1 package sanitary pads (18-24 thin maxi)

Place contents in a box or bag and deliver to 1012 G Street in Reedley. The kit will be re-packed in a new 5-gallon plastic pail with lid.

Comforters and Blankets



MCC is asking for donations of 10,000 heavy comforters and 10,000 flat sheets as part of its response to the Haiti earthquake. Sheets will be used as bedding and mosquito netting. (MCC is asking for heavy comforters rather than blankets for the Haiti response.) Thank you for joining this effort. MCC sends comforters and blankets to hospitals, refugee camps, orphanages, and locations experiencing disasters. In the last several years, shipments were sent to Afghanistan, Bosnia, Haiti, Honduras, Iran, Iraq, Kazakhstan, North Korea, Palestine, Russia, Serbia, Sudan and Ukraine.

Comforter specifications

- Use new or nearly new material
- Single/twin-size preferred (approx. 60in x 80in)
- Double/full-size accepted (approx. 82in x 90in)
- Winter weight preferred (please use quilt batting)
- Light weight to medium weight also accepted
- Knotted with crochet cotton (not more than 4-8in apart)
- Get children involved: use fabric markers or fabric crayons to draw pictures on blank muslin or solid fabric comforter tops*

Sheets

NEW flat sheets (**For Haiti, please use double, queen or king-size sheets in light colors. Sheets will also be used as mosquito netting and light colors are less attractive to mosquitoes.**)

Note: While MCC also uses purchased blankets in some responses, **heavy comforters are needed for Haiti.**
